The Program is located in Perry County. Women who choose to participate generally attend services 2-5 days per week depending on individual needs. **Staff can assist with transportation to programming as needed.**

Available Services

Project ADVANCE uses research based methods, tailored to the unique treatment needs of women in rural areas. Each person entering the program is assessed individually to determine which services are needed.

Who is Eligible?

Serves women who are:

- In need of intensive services to stabilize and recover from serious health issues including substance use and mental health disorders.
- Working toward independence from public assistance.
- Overcoming trauma from an abusive relationship (past or present).
- Non-custodial parents working to regain custody of their children.
- Resolving legal issues with the judicial system.
- Pregnant and having difficulty becoming or staying drug free.
- Affected by another family members' substance use.
